HELP NOT HARM: Is a campaign that invites support from the Catholic community for private member's bill C-218. This bill will amend the criminal code to make it illegal to provide Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) to those whose sole underlying condition is mental illness. If this bill does not pass, then this practice will become the law in Canada on March 17 next year. This would have a devastating effect on vulnerable people and their families. This campaign invites people to contact their local Member of Parliament to urge them to support this bill: time is short, as this will come to a vote in Parliament in mid-April. You may go to the "Help not Harm" website for more information and will find there an easy platform from which to email your local MP. You will find more information and a helpful "Backgrounder" on our Diocesan website. This campaign gives us an opening to stand against the growing MAiD regime in Canada and to affirm the dignity of life!

REPAIR AND MAINTENANCE INFO

1. The work on our church windows will start this Monday! The frames will be restored, and the contractors have confirmed that this is the ideal time for the project. In addition to the restoration, we're replacing broken Flexi covers and inside glacier glass protection to better preserve the windows. Then, add Acrylic Artwork with all the inside Windows. If all goes as planned, the work should be completed in the next few weeks by May.

2. Also, we need to remove all asbestos from the outside Church Wall behind the Altar and part of the House. Asbestos has lots of cracks, and it is a hazardous material.

3. We also need to update side walks of the front entrance of the Church. The surface is not even, and water is not draining properly, and make it slippery during Winter season.

4. Two roof top furnace units need to be replaced, which is the main source for heat and cooling for the Parish Hall, and providing cooling for the Church in the summer season.

These are the important projects we're focusing on to maintain and improve in our parish. To help support these efforts, we will form the Capital Campaign Committee, which will work to raise funds, build awareness of our financial needs, and encourage steady support for the parish. Thank you for your generosity—it's because of you that projects like this are possible!
