

COUPLES FOR CHRIST invites you to a renewed understanding of God's call to us as Christians, and open to married couples, single men and women, widows, and widowers. There's no signup or cost. We invite you to join our Christian Life Program for 8 weeks on Saturdays, in the month of June and July from 6pm in our St. Anne Parish Hall, after 5PM Mass. Couples for Christ runs for a total of 8 consecutive sessions with the following topics: 1) God's Love 2) Who is Jesus Christ 3) Repentance and Faith 4) Loving God and Neighbour 5) The Christian Family 6) Empowered by the Holy Spirit 7) Growing in the Spirit 8) Transformation in Christ.

SAVE THE DATE: The Cathedral of St. Peter In Chains will be marking their 200th Anniversary on Sunday June 7 at the 10:30 Mass. The Apostolic Nuncio and the Archbishop of Kingston will be the celebrants. The Mass will be followed with a Corpus Christi procession around the Cathedral and the blessing of a plaque to mark the occasion at the statue (East Lawn). Please plan to attend this significant celebration for our Cathedral.

ORDINATION OF DEACONS: The ordination to the Diaconate for three men of our diocese will be on Saturday, May 30, 11:00 a.m. at the Cathedral of St. Peter-in-Chains. Peter Bagnall, Sean Dunlop and Nic Dubonnet have been preparing for four years as participants in our Permanent Deacon Formation Program. It will be my privilege to confer the Sacrament of Holy Orders upon them as they begin their diaconal ministry in the Church – a ministry of charity, word and sacrament. Please pray for them and their families as they prepare for this day and for their dedicated service to the Church in the years to come.

PENTECOST: In the Catholic faith, Pentecost is not just a historical event - it is the fulfillment of Jesus' promise and the moment the Church became spiritually alive through the Holy Spirit. Catholics see Pentecost as deeply connected to: the Holy Trinity, the sacraments, the mission of the Church, and the transformation of the human soul. After Jesus' Ascension, the apostles were fearful and confused. On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon them. This means: God is no longer distant. The Spirit of Christ now lives within believers. Grace becomes active in the soul.

For Catholics, the Holy Spirit is the Sanctifier, the source of wisdom and courage, and the giver of divine life. Pentecost is the beginning of this new spiritual intimacy between God and humanity. Catholic teaching calls Pentecost the "birthday of the Church." Why? Because after receiving the Spirit: the apostles began preaching publicly, thousands were baptized, and the Church began its mission to the world.

Before Pentecost: the disciples were followers. After Pentecost: they became witnesses and shepherds. This is why the Catholic Church sees itself as Spirit-led, not merely a human institution. In the Tower of Babel story, humanity became divided by languages because of pride. At Pentecost: people from many nations understood the apostles, unity was restored through the Holy Spirit. The Catholic meaning: the Church is universal ("catholic" means universal), all peoples are called into one Body of Christ, true unity comes through God, not political power.

The "tongues of fire" symbolize purification from sin, burning love for God, enlightenment, and spiritual transformation. In Catholic spirituality, divine fire often represents: the love of the Holy Spirit, holiness, and the purification needed for sainthood. Pentecost teaches that holiness is not human achievement alone — it is God's grace working within a person.

Catholics believe Pentecost is not only a past event. The same Holy Spirit is received especially through: Baptism, Confirmation, the Eucharist, and the other sacraments. This is why Confirmation is often called a "personal Pentecost": the believer receives a strengthening of the Holy Spirit for mission and witness. Catholic tradition especially connects Pentecost with the seven gifts of the Spirit: These gifts help a person live in holiness and discern God's will.

At its deepest level, Pentecost means: God does not merely command humanity from outside - He enters the human heart to transform it from within. Human weakness becomes a place where divine grace acts. In Catholic mysticism, Pentecost is the ongoing life of the Holy Spirit within the soul and within the Church until the end of time.
